Daniel 11 Decoded

Jacques Doukhan

Daniel 11 is widely described as one of the most cryptic, complex texts in the Bible. Perhaps more than any other, it uses seemingly heavily coded language while ostensibly describing world events from the Persian period to our day. Thus, credible attempts by faithful scholars to read that code can lead in markedly different directions.

Writing from a solidly historicist perspective on prophetic interpretation, Jacques Doukhan lays the groundwork for this masterful study of Daniel 11 by (1) critiquing the history of its interpretation; (2) observing its literary

context; (3) closely examining its relationship to Daniel 8; (4) decoding the meaning of particular expressions; and (5) giving particular attention to the words, grammar, and literary structure of the chapter.

The bulk of Doukhan's book is comprised of a verseby-verse exegesis and commentary on the biblical text, with a methodical appeal to other sources from the history of interpretation. Throughout the years, Doukhan's own unique interpretation of Daniel 11 has been affirmed and critiqued by his academic peers. His mature view is presented here as a milestone on the pathway of our understanding.





We hear so often: "You ask too many questions." "You just don't have enough faith." Or "We should not ask questions like that!" However, the better we come to know God, the more we come to love Him and the less threatened we are by honest questions. Truth loses nothing by close investigation. To wrestle with God is acceptable, even as Jacob did (Gen. 32), as long as you refuse to let go of Him.

This book is an introduction to Christian theology from an Adventist perspective. It is written in a readerfriendly, "theology for everyone" format that can serve both as an introductory college textbook and as a sourcebook for general readers seeking to deepen their biblical knowledge and faith.

Sutherland House

Originally named Brooknook because of its vantage point overlooking Lemon Creek, a tributary of the St. Joseph River, Sutherland House was built in 1902. It was the first building erected on the Andrews University campus when the institution, then known as Battle Creek College, was moved to Berrien Springs, Michigan, and renamed Emmanuel Missionary College in the fall of 1901. The spacious two-story structure was built as the home for the school's president, Edward A. Sutherland, and was later used variously through the years as a women's residence, infirmary, and

housing for married students. By the early 1980s it was in a very poor condition and was slated for demolition. A University Trustee, Elsie L. Buck, persuaded her colleagues to save the building. Mrs. Buck raised the funds necessary for a complete renovation, and the house re-opened in 1987 as the headquarters for the Institute of World Mission. When that organization moved to new quarters in the Seminary building, Sutherland House, with the addition of a new "carriage house" that serves as the warehouse, became the home of Andrews University Press in 2005.
