Backward design involves identification of desired results, determination of acceptable evidence, and planning learning experiences and instruction to achieve the above.2. Congruency between results, performance, and classroom experiences are the intent of design.3. Selection of materials means sorting out what is worth being familiar with, important knowledge and skills, and enduring knowledge.4. This requires knowing the major enduring values, central concepts, uncoverage or correction of misconceptions of abstract ideas, capturing or engaging student in sustained inquiry.5.
