MINUTES

Dave Penner lead in a discussion of how transfer work should be presented on Andrews University transcripts. Due to changes with Banner, we need to reformat our transcripts. The following options were discussed:

POSSIBLE
CHANGES IN
TRANSCRIPTS

1. Don't record transfer credits on our transcripts.
 2. Include a list of transfer courses with our course titles that are the most equivalent.
 3. Name the institution where transfer credits were accepted from and indicate the quantity of such credits.
- (For purposes of advising, a listing on Redwood of articulated transfer courses, articulated AU equivalent and credits for each course would be needed)

The council **voted** that Andrews University will include on its transcripts the GPA, number of credits and the name of the institution where credits have been transferred from. A recommendation would be forwarded to the Graduate Council to add the inclusion of the GPA as part of their new policy for recording transfer credits- Jan 29/97.
