APPROVAL OF MINUTES

The Academic Policies committee has been considering issues such as 1) what instances of academic dishonesty should be reported centrally, 2) when do these instances reach a critical point that merits consideration by a committee, 3) should records be destroyed after five years, and 4) where to house the records (VP of Academic of Administration).

It was requested that the legal issues and language be checked by Brent Geraty.

ACADEMIC INTEGRITY

The council voted to approve the replacement of the terminology "accepted on probation" with "conditional acceptance" for new

student admissions. Once a student is at Andrews and then shows signs of needing

intervention the terminology will still be "academic probation".

"CONDITIONAL ACCEPTANCE" APPROVED

The Admissions committee is looking more at reading and English interventions. The issue of using a registration hold to ensure registration in EDPC115 Academic Assessment has been raised and may be brought to the council later.

ADMISSIONS SUBCOMMITTEE

Pat Mutch brought a request for a written policy regarding attendance requirements on days that the University is open but travel may be hazardous for some students. The council recommended that this be dealt with by faculty being reminded to use common sense on a case-by-case basis rather than written policy.

NEW NAME FOR

All names of students under consideration now come to the committee first and then various committee members carry on research regarding the students as needed.

Ann Gibson asked about a student who appeared to have no trouble except math but was on probation. This particular case will be investigated--it is believed there were other indicators of trouble.

There was some discussion regarding the advisability of changing the name of academic probation. Is this just being politically correct? Will a different name create a better environment for success? Has it helped other universities to change the name?

"ACADEMIC PROBATION"

One suggestion: Academic Success Track (are other students NOT on a success track?)

Another school has four levels of acceptance: Unconditional, Conditional, Provisional, and Probational April will track down other names for the next meeting.

The council has been asked to consider if there is a need for a faculty senate, possibly made up of a combining of the undergraduate and graduate councils. This senate would address more specific topics than the University Senate (academic and maybe financial). The comment was made that if a faculty senate is formed then it is a very different form of government and the administration must be prepared for this.
