PRIOR LEARNING ASSESSMENT

PLA is validated and granted through a prescribed portfolio presentation process. This credit-granting option is available only to students 24 years of age or older. It is for adult learners who desire tangible recognition through academic credit for their knowledge already acquired in subject areas as a result of on-the-job training, community service activities, non-credit courses, and/or special accomplishments. INTERNATIONAL BACCALAUREATE

Andrews University recognizes scores from the International Baccalaureate (IB) exam as follows:

- For general education courses, a score of 4 (Higher level) is considered for general education credit.
- For major-level courses, a score of at least 5 (Higher Level) will be considered through review by the department for credit towards major requirements.
- The student may be allowed to enroll in a sophomore level major-level course with the purpose of validating the IB experience. If a grade of at least B- is obtained in the sophomore level course, credit for the freshman level major course(s) would be given.

ADVANCED LEVEL CREDIT

Students with A-level passes may be awarded up to 10 credits for each A-level pass. These credits may be used as applicable toward graduation requirements, including general education, major, concentration, minor, and general electives, <u>as approved by the respective academic departments.</u> A list of courses that may be given may be obtained from the Undergraduate Records Office, Room 202, in the Administration Building.

TRANSFER STUDENTS

Transfer students wishing to apply CLEP or DANTES credits to their Andrews degree must have a CLEP or DANTES transcript sent to the Andrews Counseling and Testing Center for score evaluation by Andrews University standards. A fee is charged for this evaluation (see the financial section of the Bulletin). Credit is allowed if the student scores at or above a 50 in a CLEP Subject Examination. Selected DANTES Subject Standardized Tests have been approved as a basis for credit at Andrews University.

OTHER TESTING PROGRAM

Nationally normed tests provided by professional organizations in specific subject matter fields may be used where CLEP tests are not available. In fields in which no nationally normed tests exist, departmentally constructed tests may be used. A fee will be assessed by the academic department.

NOTE:

Regardless of the method, the maximum amount of credit which may be applied to a baccalaureate degree is 32 semester credits from the areas listed in this booklet except Advanced Level Credit.

Credit by examination is never regarded the same as credit taken in residence. No type of credit by examination may be used to replace failures or other low grades received at Andrews University.

Credit by Examination fees are listed in the financial section of the Bulletin.

CLEP: MATHEMATICS: Mathematics Placement Examination (MPE) must have been taken within last two years. College Algebra, P4 or P5; Precalculus, P5; Calculus, P5 and a score of 35 out of 40 in the algebra/precalculus sections.

SPECIAL NOTE ON ENGLISH COMPOSITION & COMPUTER TOOLS: <u>NO</u> credit will be granted for Freshman/English Composition and Computer Tools by CLEP.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT OPPORTUNITIES

This applies only to matriculated students in good and regular standing.

ADVANCED PLACEMENT PROGRAM (APP)

Andrews University cooperates with the College Entrance Examination Board (CEEB) in this organization's Advanced Placement Program (APP).

Some secondary schools offer selected students the opportunity to accelerate learning by taking one or more subjects at the college level during their senior year. In May of each year, the CEEB gives a set of Advanced Placement (AP) examinations which cover this advanced work. Examinations are graded on a five-point scale as follows: 1 – no recommendation; 2 – possibly qualified; 3 – qualified; 4 – well qualified; 5 – extremely well qualified. The faculty at Andrews University voted to give credit to the extent of the corresponding course offered on this campus if the score is 3 or better. *There are exceptions as noted on the back.*

A list of accepted courses and scores are listed on the back of this booklet.

COLLEGE LEVEL EXAMINATION PROGRAM (CLEP)

Andrews University realized that students who have achieved college-level proficiency on the basis of work experience and informal study ought to receive credit for what they know, regardless of when, where, how, or from whom they learned it. The CLEP program of the CEEB has been set up for this purpose, and Andrews University is participating in the program.

Only first year in residence students – freshmen, sophomores, and juniors – may earn credits by CLEP. It would be to the student's advantage when planning his college program to take the test before college registration.
