TRANSCRIPTS

Submit official transcript(s) from the secondary school (high school or academy) that you graduated from as well as any college or university you attended or received credit from. All undergraduate applicants must submit a final/official secondary school transcript as required by Michigan State Law. Please send transcripts directly to the Andrews University Office of Undergraduate Admissions from the high school you graduated from and/or colleges or universities you attended.

ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES

At least a 2.50 cumulative high school and/or college GPA is required for admission to Andrews University; or, an overall GED score of at least the 50th percentile. ADMISSIONS GUIDELINES continued

- > Entering freshmen must be a high school graduate or equivalent (with less than 25 credits of college level coursework after high school graduation): ACT/ SAT composite and individual scores of at least the 50th percentile (for good and regular admission).
- Transfer students (25 or more credits of college level coursework after high school graduation): ACT/SAT tests are recommended, but not required.
- Homeschool students: Please explore our complete requirements and guidelines at www.andrews.edu/ homeschool.
- > International students: Transcripts and exam scores will be evaluated in accordance with published academic equivalency guidelines for the country where you studied. Educational Summary sheet needs to be completed and submitted. College or university transcripts issued in a language other than English must be accompanied by an authorized English translation. You may find more information at www. andrews.edu/go/intlguide.
- English Proficiency: If English is not your first language, you will need to meet English proficiency requirements before you can enroll as a full-time Andrews University student, as outlined online at: www.andrews.edu/go/ciep. Courses in our Intensive English Program on campus are available if needed.

ADMISSION STATUS

Your application, academic records and test scores will be reviewed by the Undergraduate Admissions Committee. Upon admission, we'll share with you the steps you'll need to take to enroll in classes as a student at Andrews University.

Students who do not meet the university's undergraduate admissions standards will receive a letter outlining the standards that were not met, and the alternatives open to the student for re-application in the future (including improved test scores or successfully-completed college level coursework).

Additionally, some transfer students who do not meet the GPA requirement of 2.50 or above, but who show significant potential, may be admitted with specific class assignments.
